This year tickets may be purchased <u>online through OSP</u> from 3/18-24 at the discount* price and from 3/25—4/19 for \$85.

- Students who plan to bring a date who does NOT attend MRHS must present a completed <u>Prom Guest Request</u> form at the time of ticket purchase. This form requires signatures and the approval of MRHS Administration, so plan ahead!
- ALL obligations must be cleared before a student is permitted o purchase or pick up an online purchased ticket. Students may check with Ms. Romero in the front office for obligation details.
- Prom tickets are non-refundable due to illness, change in plans, or any unforeseen circumstances.

*The cost will be \$85 per ticket after March 24. An online purchase is not considered a "ticket" until the online receipt is redeemed during lunch on sale days.



There's no need to get out of your vehicle. Just look for the teens in bright green shirts holding the signs and directing traffic around the parking lot. Howard County Police will receive, secure, and transport your medications for proper disposal. Medical personnel will receive and handle all of your sharps for proper recycling. Be sure to secure your medications to keep them out of the hands of everyone for whom they are not prescribed.
