PSAT (Grade 9) – PSAT/NMSQT (Grades 10-11) All 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students will be participating in the administration of the PSAT on Wed., October 11, 2017. Freshman will participate in the PSAT 8/9 while sophomores and juniors participate in the PSAT/NMSQT. All students have been pre-registered.

Students in the 10th and 11th grades have received the PSAT-NMSQT Student Guide through their English classes. The College Board has made the PSAT-8/9 Student Guide available to 9th grade students in .pdf format. The 22-page document is available by <u>clicking here</u>.
