Senior Week: Staying Safe in Ocean City:

HC DrugFree will present two programs, **"SENIOR WEEK: STAYING SAFE IN OCEAN CITY"** aimed at parents and high school seniors as they prepare for the annual Senior Week activities in Ocean City.

The presentations will be held on **Tuesday, March 15 at 7 p.m. at Howard High School and Tuesday, March 22 at 7 p.m. at Atholton High School**. Speakers will include Ocean City Police Corporal Howard Caplan and Sergeant James McVey, also a Howard County teacher.

The event is part of HC DrugFree's "Be a Parent Not a Friend" campaign that is a resource for parents on avoiding underaged drinking. Aimed at both seniors and their parents, the presentation provides a better understanding of the facts and options involved with Senior Week. "By attending the upcoming presentation, young people can ensure that they make lifetime memories without taking tragic risks," said Joan Webb Scornaienchi, executive director of HC DrugFree who will also speak at the presentations. "We are not trying to dissuade parents from sending their seniors; rather we aim to help make Senior Week a safe experience for teens and a worry-free week for their parents," she said.

High school seniors — and their parents — will be made aware of the rules in Ocean City during senior week. From the simplest rules, such as playing loud music too late at night can result in a \$70 fine — to major drug and alcohol infractions.

Sister Cities Summer International Camp Program - Deadline extended to March 21 10th - 12th graders can still apply for Columbia Association's (CA) annual summer Sister Cities High School Exchange program in France or Spain! The international exchange camp is open to high school students studying Spanish or French (level 2 and up) who reside in Howard County. Participants spend approximately two weeks of cultural and linguistic immersion during the summer in one of Columbia's European sister cities: Cergy-Pontoise in France or Tres Cantos in Spain. During this time, they are hosted by the family of a French or Spanish student. After returning to the United States, students host their French/Spanish counterparts for another two weeks. Throughout the trip, there are lots of organized group activities for the participants, both abroad and in the U.S. Teacjers say that students' language skills increase a lot through this summer camp; parents report their children become much more independent. This year's participants will depart with their respective chaperoned groups for France or Spain on June 26 & 27. The program then runs through the end of July. The program fee is \$700 for Columbia residents and \$850 for nonresidents and airline tickets will be ~\$1,300 to \$1,500 per participant. There are excellent scholarships available for Columbia residents who qualify. Deadline is March 21.
