ATTENTION SENIORS!!

Maryland Higher Education Commission have made changes to the Howard P. Rawlings Guaranteed Grant and this can affect you!

Students who meet the income requirements for the Maryland Higher Education Commission Guaranteed Access (GA) Grant (identified through information on your completed FAFSA form), will automatically be considered for this scholarship for the 2017 -2018 academic year. The FAFSA window opened up on October 1st and the deadline will remain as March 1st to have priority consideration. The Office of Student Financial Assistance will continue to identify potentially eligible GA Grant recipients weekly until April 1st. There is no longer a separate application process for students to complete in order to be considered for this GA Grant. To be considered for this Grant, it is solely based upon the completion of the FAFSA no later than April 1st! Any student that has been identified by the Office of Student Financial Assistance potentially eligible for the GA Grant will be notified via email.
