PSAT Score Information

Attention Parents of Students in Grades 9, 10 and 11 - On October 19, 2016, students in grades 9-11 participated in the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) assessment. Students who included an email address on their test booklets should have received an email from the College Board on December 12 containing directions to access their assessment results online.

Paper home reports were distributed before the winter break to 10th and 11th grade students. Reports for 9th grade students will be distributed during 3rd period on Monday, January 30. The home report will also include an access code for students who did not enter an email address at the time of testing.

To assist families with interpreting the results, HCPSS will host a PSAT parent night on January 31, 2017, at 7 p.m., at Long Reach High School.


