

For Graduating Senior Students/Parents

This is to inform you that each graduate's name will be displayed on their diploma as is on their report card, with a first, middle and last name spelled out. This information is being retrieved from the school system database for each student.

Diploma Signature Forms will be given out in English classes the week of September 11th. These forms are used to verify graduate's names and are to be signed and returned to Student Services as soon as possible.

Keep in mind that a diploma is a legal document. Students' legal names (as on their birth certificate) with a first, middle, and last name should be used.
